

CHIPPEWA COUNTY FRIEND OF THE COURT  
POLICY FOR MAKEUP PARENTING TIME

THE PARTIES HAVE AN AFFIRMATIVE DUTY TO OBEY ALL PARENTING TIME ORDERS

If you believe your parenting time is wrongfully denied, based on the current order, you may file a Complaint Alleging a Parenting Time Violation. You must file your alleged violation with the Friend of the Court office *no later than within seven (7) days of the actual days denied.*

All violations must be in writing (8 ½ x 11 sheet of paper) with the following information:

1. Plaintiff's name and address
2. Defendant's name and address
3. Your case (file) number (#)
4. State what the current parenting time order dictates
5. Specifically outline, based on the current order, why you believe your parenting time has been violated (dates, times, locations of the parenting time exchange, and any additional information necessary).

\*A copy of your complaint will be mailed to the other party, as that party has 21 days to object (FOC 16)\*

Whether or not parenting time was wrongfully denied shall be determined by the Chippewa County Friend of the Court.



If the Friend of the Court determines that there was a wrongful denial of parenting time, makeup parenting time shall be awarded for the duration of time in which the violation transpired. If a party continues to violate the current order, additional days of makeup parenting time may be awarded and/or a show cause hearing scheduled before the Court seeking a contempt order for violating the current order.

If the Court finds that a party has violated the current order without good cause, the court shall find that parent in contempt and may impose sanctions listed under MCL 552.644.
