## I. PROCEDURAL GUIDELINES

- A. The Chippewa County Correctional Facility will use a coordinated, multidisciplinary team approach to responding to sexual abuse and assault, which, in accordance with community practices, includes a medical practitioner, a mental health practitioner, a security staff member and an investigator from the assigned investigative entity, as well as representatives from outside entities that provide relevant services and expertise.
- B. The Chippewa County Correctional Facility shall attempt to make available to the victim a victim advocate from a rape crisis center. If a rape crisis center is not available to provide victim advocate services, ICE/ERO will provide these services by making available a qualified staff member from a community-based organization, or a qualified agency staff member.
- C. The victim advocate shall provide emotional support, crisis intervention, information, and referrals.
