PA 202 Waiver Approval

PA 202 mandates funding levels for post employment benefits be at 40% and our defined benefit pension be at 60%. As of the end of 2017 our pension is funded at 52% and OPEB was at zero (0). In 2018 a Section 115 Trust was established to begin to address the unfunded OPEB. To date \$800,000 has been set aside for that purpose. Additional funding will be added when available. As of the end of 2017 both plans are out of compliance and waiver requests have been prepared for submittal to the Department of Treasury upon approval of the Board.
