WHEREAS, the has been invited by the Michigan Strategic Fund to submit a CDBG application in the amount of \$56,000; and

WHEREAS, Chippewa County desires to use the CDBG funds for the development of the Eastern Upper Peninsula Transportation-Logistics Strategy, an effort led by the Eastern Upper Peninsula Regional Planning & Development Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Chippewa County commits local funds from the Eastern Upper Peninsula Regional Planning & Development Commission's Michigan Regional Prosperity Initiative grant award, Chippewa County Economic Development Corporation, and a Local Technical Assistance grant awarded to the Eastern Upper Peninsula Regional Planning & Development Commission in the amount of \$56,000; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the local community development plan, *Elevating the Eastern Upper Peninsula*, the region's U.S. EDA Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy and Michigan Regional Prosperity Initiative plan as described in the Application; and
