#### Prosecutors



The Prosecutors try to make sure that someone is held responsible when they hurt somebody.

#### Victim Advocate



The person who tells the victim and the witnesses about the court and answers any questions they may have. You can also tell this person if you are afraid or worried about anything.

#### Court Reporters





The Court Reporter writes down everything that is said in the courtroom



Makes sure the courtroom rules are obeyed.

#### Defense Attorney



The lawyer who helps the person accused of breaking the law. He or she asks the witness questions in court.

#### Witness



A person who saw the crime happen or who knows something about the crime.

#### Defendant



The person accused of breaking the law.

You will go into the courtroom and the judge will ask you to promise to tell the truth. The prosecutor will ask you questions. The defense attorney will ask you questions. The judge may also ask you some questions. Tell all of them the truth.

# Later on, you may have to come back to court to tell a jury what happened



The jury hears all the witnesses and then decides if the defendant is guilty or not guilty. If it is decided the defendant is guilty, the judge decides what sentence the defendant will get.

You may want to come back to court one last time and tell the judge what you think the defendant's punishment should be and what special help the defendant should get.
