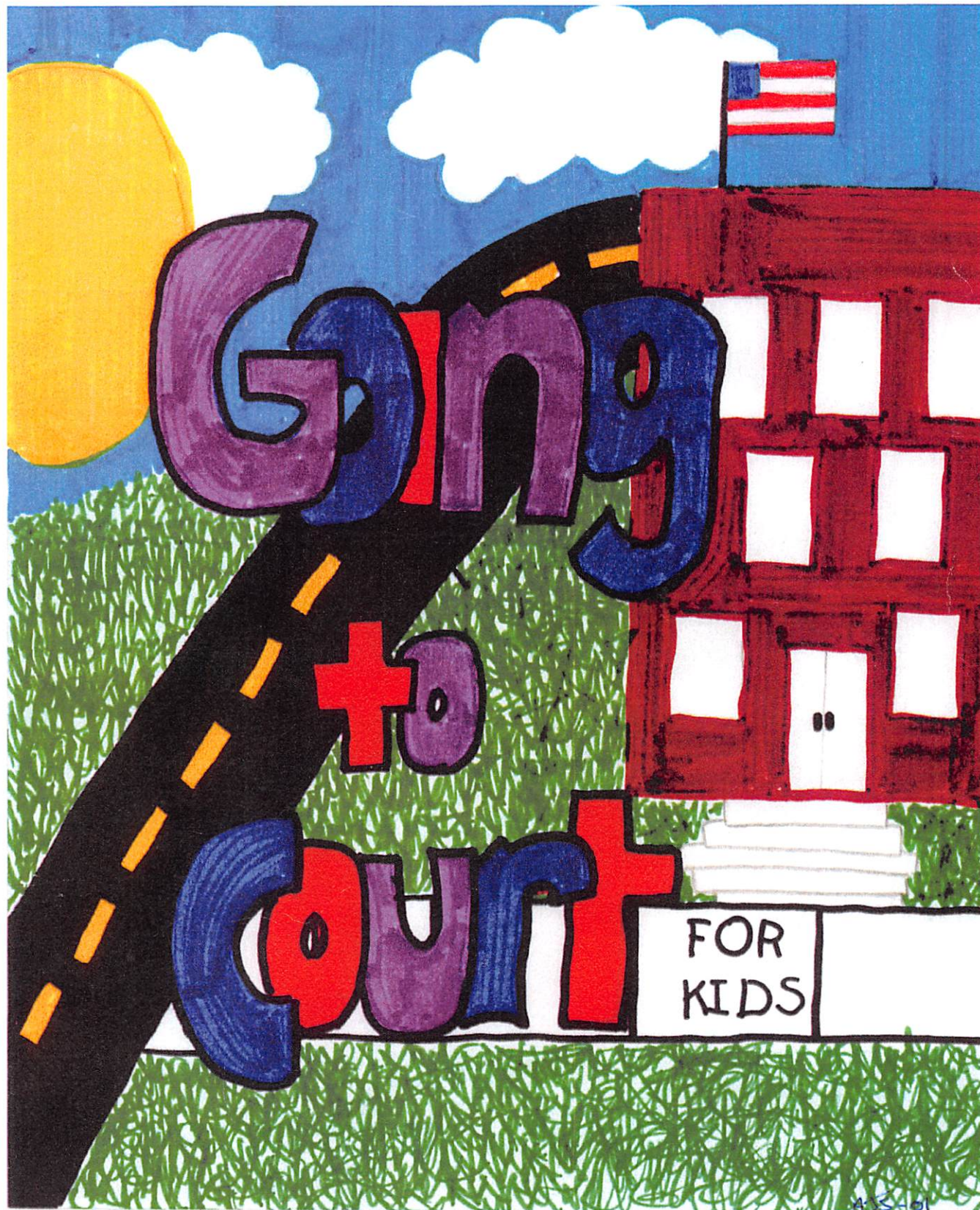
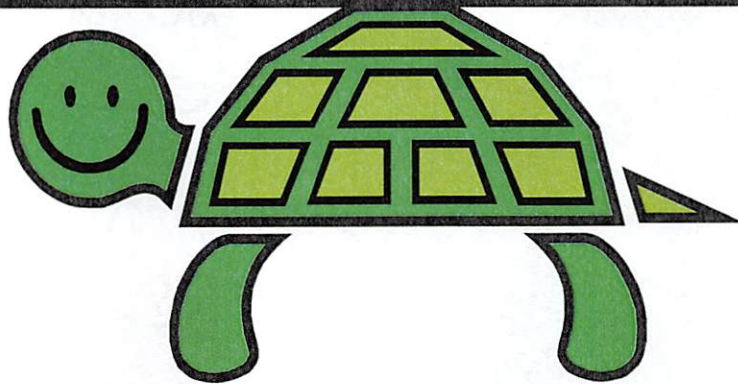

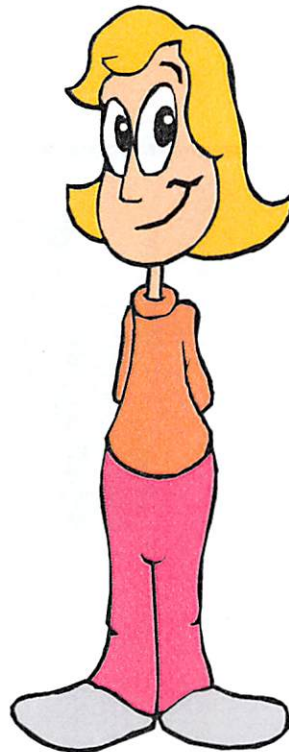

The detective you talked to will also get a subpoena for court and will meet you there.



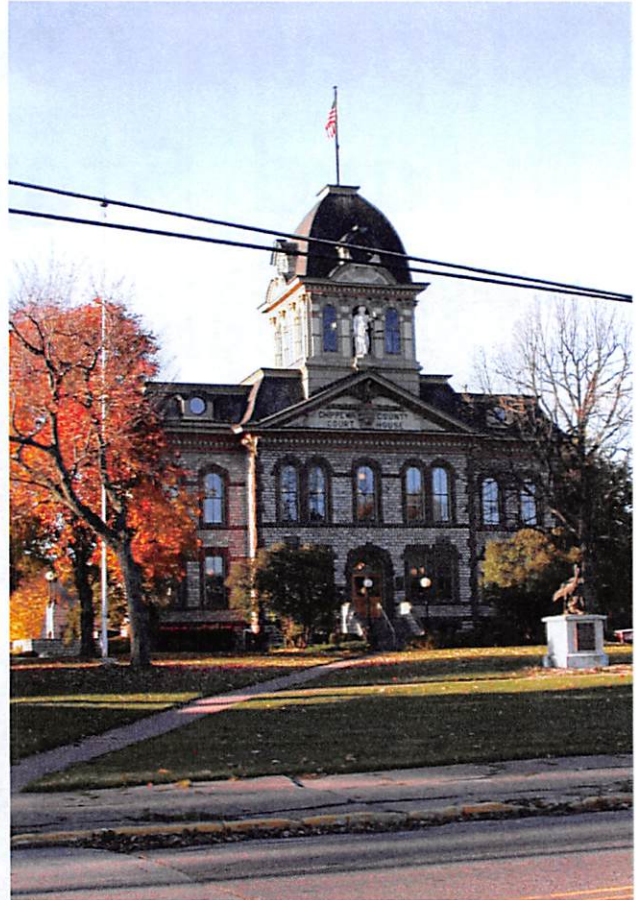

Court Reporters



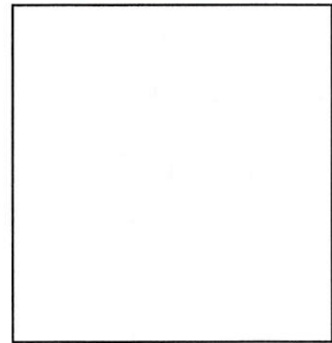
The Court Reporter writes down everything that is said in the courtroom

Bailiff



Makes sure the courtroom rules are obeyed.

Draw yourself here



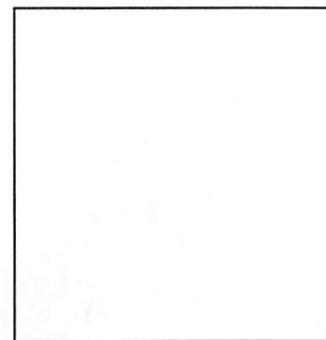
A person who saw the crime happen or who knows something about the crime.

Defense Attorney



The lawyer who helps the person accused of breaking the law. He or she asks the witness questions in court.

Defendant



The person accused of breaking the law.

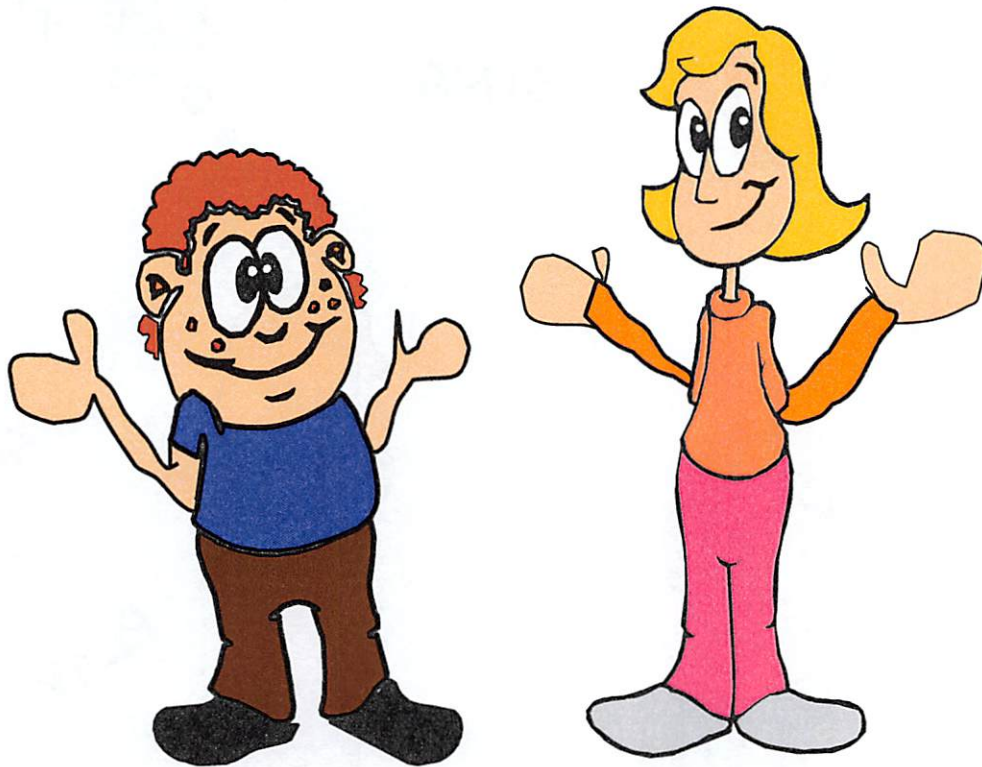

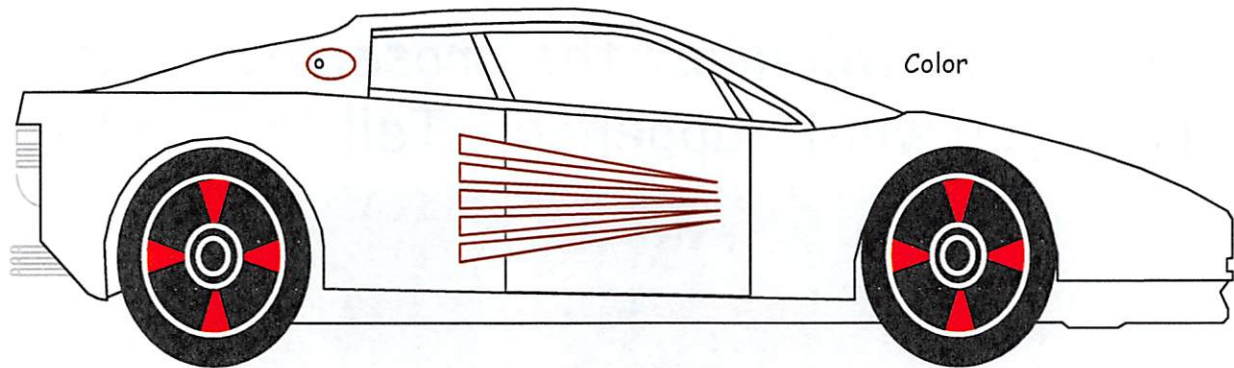

This is an airplane.



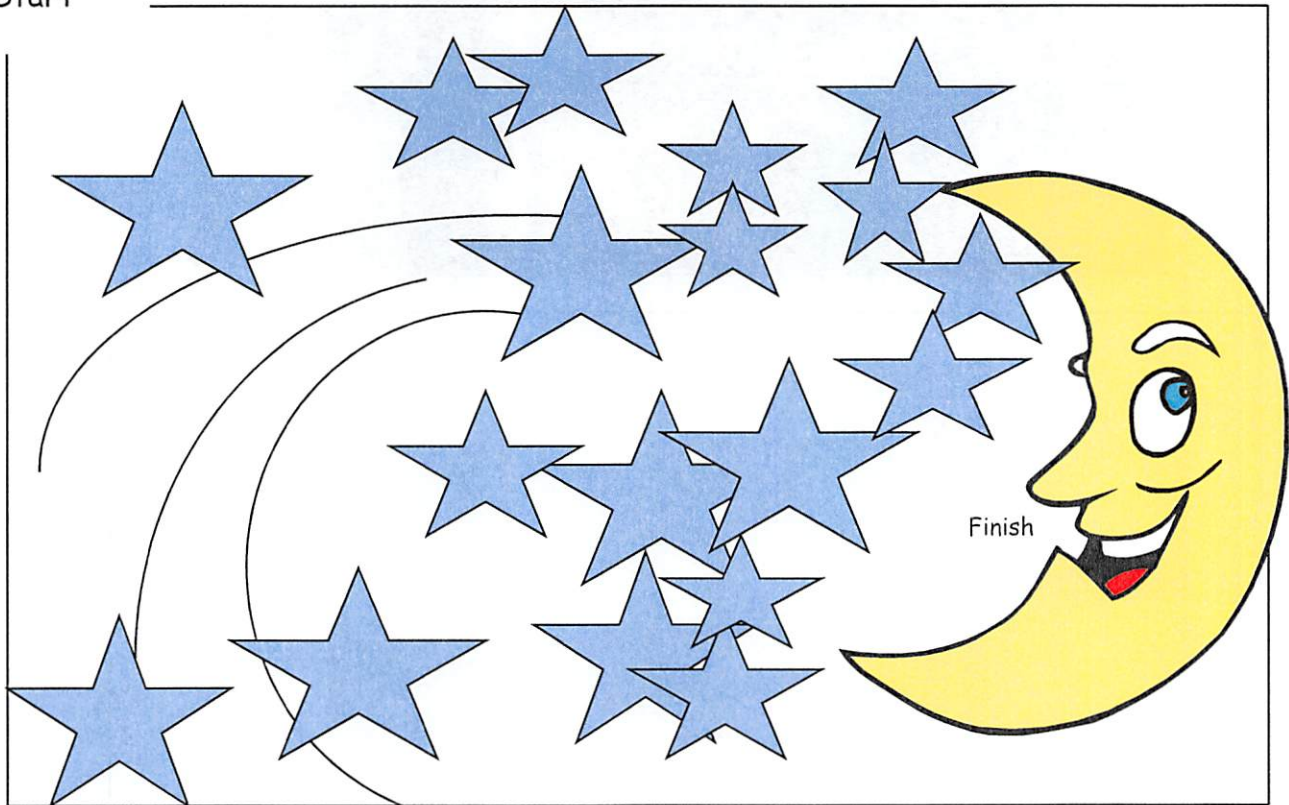

Then:

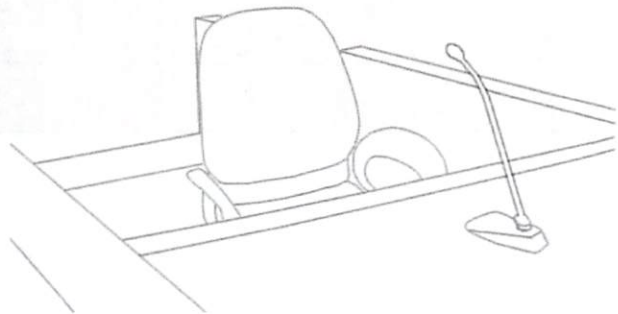
You will go into the courtroom and the judge will ask you to promise to tell the truth.

Draw a picture of yourself on the Witness Chair

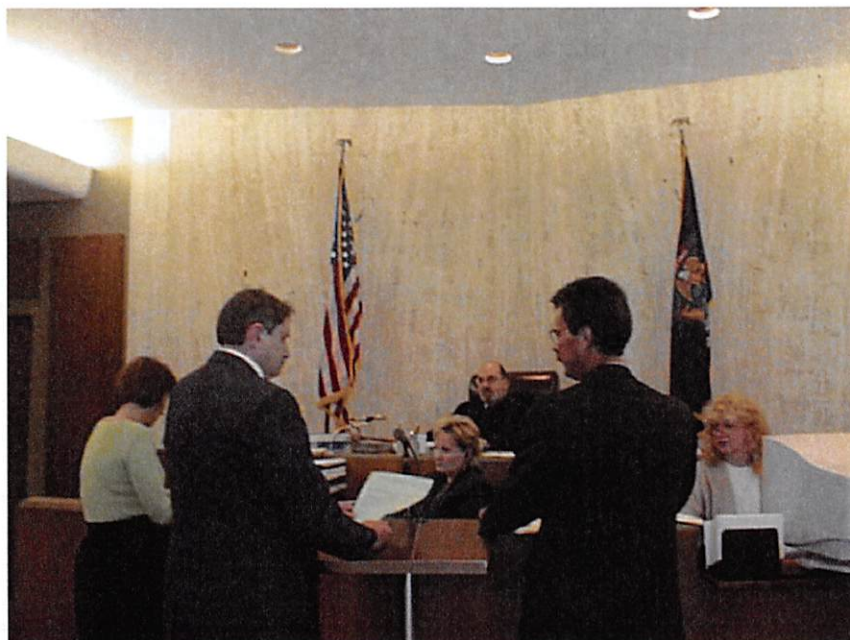
Later on, you may have

The jury hears all the witnesses
and then decides if the defendant
is guilty or not guilty.

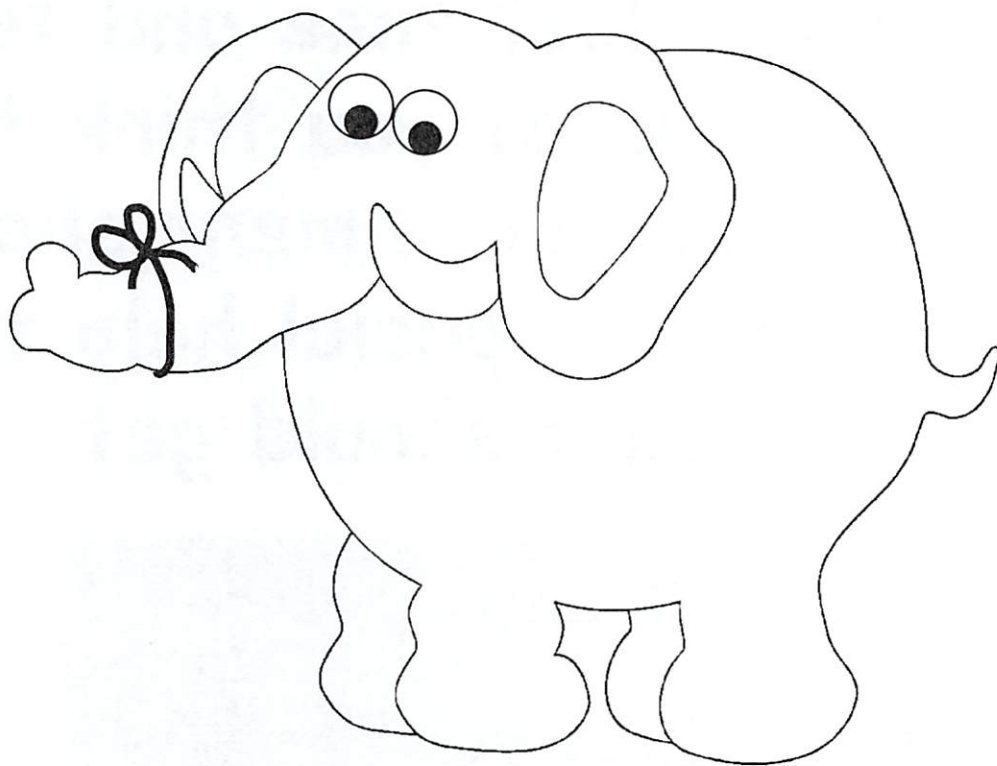
If it is decided the defendant is guilty, the judge decides what sentence the defendant will get.

You may want to come back to court one last time and tell the judge what you think the defendant's punishment should be and what special help the defendant should get.

If you ever have a question or something has you worried, call your victim advocate.

Prosecutor or Prosecuting Attorney	The people who hear all the witnesses and then decide if the defendant is guilty or not guilty.
Defense Attorney Or Defendant's Attorney	The punishment or special help the Judge says the defendant will get.
